From the Superintendent

March is here and opening day of our season's golf activities is a little more than a month away. Our concerns are again concentrated on promoting fast, healthy green-up, especially on the greens.

In an effort to achieve this the snow will be removed from all the greens when the first thaw is evident. The greens will then be assessed and our nine greens covers spread over the greens which show the most winter injury.

The covers are designed to permit air and water circulation while preventing dessication and keeping soil temperatures several degrees warmer than surrounding areas. The results over the past two years were definitely noticeable. The covered areas showed early germination of existing *Poa Annua* seeds as well as newly spread Bentgrass seeds: a significant factor. A large percentage of the greens infested with the *Poa Annua* must recover each year by the germination of seed in turf injured areas.

We are confident that the use of these covers during the months of March and April will give us a two to three week head start on getting the Golf Course into good playing condition.

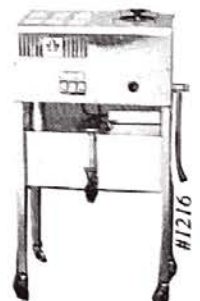

From the Ice Maker "Ice Cleaning"

Ice maintenance is an important part of Curling. We use the Pro Oxy Melter to resurface and clean our ice. Resurfacing by "deep-burning" is done first. The Pro Oxy Melter is automatically drawn down the sheet from end to end at a speed of about three feet per minute or 45 minutes for each sheet of ice.

This operation simulates flooding by melting the ice to allow 1/16th inch of water to seek its own level. The dirt particles from brooms, shoes, etc., float and freeze on the ice surface which can be removed by cleaning.

Cleaning is done by again pulling the burner down the sheet but this time at a speed of about 10 feet per minute or 15 minutes for each sheet of ice. This melts a very thin thickness of ice and loosens any dirt particles on the surface. This dirty water is then squeegeed to one side of the ice where it is vacuumed up by a water vacuum leaving a level clean sheet of ice behind. The ice is then scraped and pebbled. The rocks are set down on thin wooden strips which allows the rocks to cool without melting onto the ice and after an hour or so the ice is ready for play.

Deep burning is done once every two weeks, the new building one week and the Annex the following week. I hope this will give you an idea of how your ice is maintained.
