From the Icemaker

Last month's article covered the painting and sealing of a sheet of curling ice. We are now ready to move on to laying ribbons and cutting the rings.

We start with the circles which are cut with a router. The router is placed in a jig much like a compass and grooves are cut at one, four, eight and twelve foot intervals approximately 3/8 of an inch deep. Each end of the sheet is also routed to define the areas for rocks not in play. Once this is completed, we are ready to paint. The paint is applied with brushes and rollers with the routed areas filled in by using an oil can with the appropriate color. The painted areas are then sealed with a fine jet spray to prevent the paint from lifting. We are now able to lay ribbons.

We use 1/2 inch ribbons for the back, tee and centerline, with 4 inch ribbon at the hog line. These are first placed in water then pulled to predetermined marks on the dividers and pressed and frozen to the ice surface. These are then sealed to prevent floating. As soon as the ribbons and paint have been sufficiently sealed we apply our final four floods.

We now have a complete sheet of curling ice. It is then made ready for play by cutting hacks, cleaning, blading and pebbling.

I hope this series of articles has given you some insight into how our curling ice is made. In next month's article, I will cover our daily maintenance program.

From the Superintendent

PURCHASING NEW EQUIPMENT

One of the privileges enjoyed by many Golf Course Superintendents is being able to attend one or more of the many turf conferences being held throughout the country during the winter months. A part of these shows is a large equipment display where turf managers can see and talk to equipment representatives about what's new and better in the line of golf course mowers and maintenance equipment.

One type of mower which has become popular over the last few years is the lightweight fairway mower. Reduced weight and increased maneuverability are two very desirable features which would improve the playability of our fairways while a decreased cutting width and mowing speed are factors which could increase cost per acre and need to be considered before making a purchase. We find, however, that while replacement cost for our conventional fairway mower is approximately \$60,000.00, we are able to purchase two of the lightweight fairway mowers for the same price. This means that while two operators would be needed, an extra 50 inches of cutting width would be obtained and even at a slightly lower mowing speed, mowing time would be reduced and the cost of the extra operator would be offset.

While the condition of our fairways over the past few years has been acceptable, we find ourselves in a position where the mower doing the rough needs to be replaced. We feel that while our present fairway mower is still in exceptionally good condition, replacing it with two lightweight fairway mowers will allow us to use it to cut rough and eliminate the necessity to spend big dollars on a low priority area of the golf course.

As the person responsible for maintaining and improving the quality of your golf course, I am very grateful for the policies which have been adopted to purchase new equipment and upgrade our line of equipment each year. We find ourselves experiencing fewer breakdowns each summer which relates to more consistent cutting and more time for me and my staff to spend making improvements. I hope that brief explanations such as the one given above will show that purchases are being carefully thought out and being made solely with the purpose of continual course improvements.

Junior Curling League

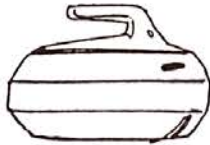

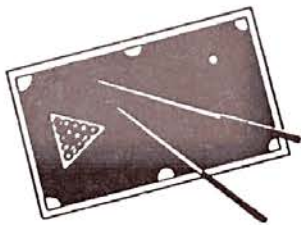
Georgian Contest
