From the Board of Directors

On August 1, 1991 the British Columbia Council of Human Rights received a complaint alleging that the policy of the Prince George Golf and Curling Club which prohibited female members from golfing on Saturday and Sunday mornings constituted a violation of the Human Rights Act. This complaint is presently being held in abeyance pending the outcome of deliberations on amending our policy.

A Human Rights Committee was struck to deal with the issue and make a recommendation to the Board of Directors. Based on the recommendation and other factors, the following golf categories will be in place for the 1992 Golf Season:

- Members Prime Time
- Senior Members Prime Time
- Members Non Prime Time
- Senior Non Prime Time
- Juniors
- Intermediate

Definitions:

- Member Prime Time** Full playing privileges except restricted times; i.e., Men's and Ladies' Day
- * Senior Member Prime Time** Full playing privileges except restricted times; i.e., Men's and Ladies' Day!
- Member Non Prime Time** Not permitted to play on weekends and statutory holidays or Tuesday and Wednesday during restricted times
- * Senior Member Non Prime Time** Not permitted to play on weekends and statutory holidays on Tuesday and Wednesday during restricted times
- Junior** A person who has not reached their nineteenth birthday before midnight August 31, 1992
- Intermediate** A person who is nineteen years of age and has not reached the age of twenty-five prior to August 31, 1992 and is in full time attendance at a post secondary educational institution

* Note: Senior is defined as 65 years of age as of December 31st of the preceding calendar year.

This new policy has been reviewed by our solicitor and by the Human Rights Council and with its adoption, the Prince

George Golf and Curling Club will no longer be in violation of the Human Rights Act.

Golf rates have not been increased since 1990. In 1991 because of the G.S.T. and the substantial financial impact to members, golf rates were not increased. Unfortunately, costs associated with running our Club have increased and in order to meet 1992 budgetary expectation, rates have been adjusted to show an overall 5% increase over 1991 figures.

The discrimination issue and the new structure has made setting 1992 golf rates a difficult matter. With equality there is a price to pay, but it is hoped that each golfing member has been left with an option to fit his or her particular situation. The 1992 golf rates have been set as follows:

Member Prime Time	\$575.00
Senior Member Prime Time	\$465.00
Member Non Prime Time	\$425.00
Senior Member Non Prime Time	\$350.00
Juniors	\$165.00
Intermediates	\$325.00

All rates quoted are subject to G.S.T.

The policy as adopted meets the requirements of the Constitution and Bylaws as laid out in Section 6.(3)(b). Section 6.(3)(b) reads as follows:

The immediate family of a regular member in good standing and of the designate of a corporate member in good standing, namely, his spouse, children under the age of nineteen years and children normally resident in the member's or designate's domicile who are over the age of nineteen but not over the age of twenty-five years and are in regular attendance at school, college, university or other educational institution, shall be entitled to the privileges of a regular member except those of voting at meetings of members and holding office but subject to the payment by the member of the fees and dues set from time to time by the directors subject to all and every regulation and rules of the society.

Because the spouse of a regular member is entitled to exactly the same privileges, the Constitution and Bylaws does not have to change. therefore, ratification by the General Membership is not required.

This decision, because of the major impact it will have on our club, has not been taken lightly by the Human Rights Committee, Golf Committee or the Board of Directors. It is felt by all three parties that this decision was made in the best interests of the club, short and long term.

From the Golf Committee

Further to the article included in the March issue of the Georgian and the current issue of the Georgian, we are providing the following points of clarification.

Member Prime Time:

Full playing privileges except restricted times; i.e., Men's and Ladies' Days.

Senior Member Prime Time:

Full playing privileges except restricted times; i.e., Men's and Ladies' Days

What this means is that men cannot participate in Ladies' Day and ladies cannot participate in Men's Night. Ladies holding full playing privileges can participate in Ladies' Day and men holding full playing privileges can participate in Men's Night.

Member Non Prime Time:

Not permitted to play on weekends and statutory holidays or Tuesdays and Wednesdays during restricted times.

Senior Member Non Prime Time:

Not permitted to play on weekends and statutory holidays or Tuesdays and Wednesdays during restricted times.

What this means is that anyone holding Non Prime Time privileges cannot golf at all on a Saturday, Sunday or statutory holiday. If they wish to do so they would be required to pay a daily Green Fee. In addition Non Prime Time holders cannot participate in Men's or Ladies' Days.

The club in 1992 will sell 700 Annual Golf Dues. This number is made up from the following categories: Member Prime Time, Senior Member Prime, Member Non Prime Time, and Senior Member Non Prime Time. Members on the Golf Waiting List will have the choice of which classification they will play under when they reach the top of the list.

In the meantime, Members with their names on the Golf Waiting List will pay Society Member Green Fees. When they have paid an amount equivalent to the Member Prime Time Rate or in the case of Seniors the Senior Prime Time Rate. They are entitled to apply to the General Manager for an exemption card for the remainder of the golf season. It is the Member's responsibility to keep Green Fee receipts for verification of the amount paid when applying for an exemption card. It is not the Club's responsibility to produce these receipts.

We trust this clarifies the intent of the privileges to which each category is entitled.

Golf Course Etiquette and Regulations

1. All Members and Green Fee Players must be dressed in a manner that will uphold the dignity of the club at all times, as outlined by the criteria of the Dress Code.
2. Only golf shoes or running shoes are allowed on the course; no boots or high heeled soles will be permitted.
3. Children under the age of 16 are not permitted on the course, unless he or she is a registered Junior Member of the Club, or accompanied by an adult 19 years of age or older or a participant in a Club sanctioned event. Children under the age of 6 are not permitted on the Course at any time, nor are non-participating Juniors under 16 (authorized caddies shall be the exception to the rule).
4. Green Fee tickets must be carried on the Course at all times.
5. Each person in a foursome must have a set of clubs and a bag.
6. All carts and cars must be kept off tees, greens and out of sandtraps.
7. Power carts are not permitted among trees.
8. Only 2 persons and 2 golf bags are permitted on a car at one time.
9. No player should play until participants in front are out of range.
10. Participants must replace divots, repair ball marks and rake sand traps after use.
11. Please replace rakes inside traps parallel to the fairway.
12. Slow play is not permitted. Members are accustomed to a 4 hour round. If you are unable to keep up, wave the following group through.
13. Players stopping off in the clubhouse after the 9 holes have NO priority at the 10th tee.
14. No alcoholic beverages are allowed on the course except in allocated area, i.e., Concession Stand.
15. Language and conduct should be kept under control at all times.
16. Rules of play shall be governed by the rules and regulations as set out by the R.C.G.A. and the Club's local rules.

It is the duty of every member of the Club and guests to familiarize themselves with the Club Rules and Regulations, as ignorance thereof shall not excuse a member for any breach or neglect of the same.

Thank you for your cooperation. Following your round you are very welcome to enjoy our full clubhouse facilities.

Golf Waiting List Criteria

Due to the ever increasing demands being placed on our golf course, the Board of Directors has found it necessary to limit the number of Annual Golf Dues sold in any one year. The Golf Committee, in conjunction with the Board of Directors has formulated a Golf Waiting List with the criteria outlined as follows:

1. Maximum number of Annual Golf Dues will be set at 700. This number will be made up of the following categories:
 Members Prime Time
 Senior Members Prime Time
 Members Non Prime Time
 Senior Member Non Prime Time

We will continue to accept **unlimited juniors**.

2. All members who paid Annual Golf Dues in 1991 will have first priority for a Golf Membership in 1992, providing their Annual Dues are paid on or before March 31, 1992.
3. If an Annual Golf Dues paying member moves away from Prince George, and returns to Prince George within 3 years, they would be extended playing privileges. After this 3 year time frame, the member would be required to place their name on the Golf Waiting List to obtain playing privileges.
4. In the event of ill health, sickness or any other unusual circumstance, the Board of Directors will address each case on an individual basis.
5. The length of the Golf Waiting List will be unlimited. In order to place your name and have it remain on the Golf Waiting List you must be an active Member of the Society. The membership cannot be in dormancy.
6. On Corporate Memberships where the designate in the previous year held Annual Dues privileges, in the event of transfer, the new designate would assume the Annual Dues privileges. this is applicable only if the membership remains active and a new designate installed in the same golf season.

The Golf Committee and Board of Directors would ask that all members, those presently golfing and those considering golfing in the future to carefully read the criteria of the Golf Waiting List to determine its effect on your particular situation.

Members who paid Annual Golf Dues in 1991, please note the March 31, 1992 deadline for ensuring playing privileges. Members who have not golfed in the past, but are considering doing so in the future, please consider now the timing of your name being placed on the Golf Waiting List to obtain playing privileges.
