Notice of Annual General Meeting

Take notice that the Annual General Meeting of the Prince George Golf & Curling Club will be held in the Games Room of the Main Clubhouse Building, at the intersection of the Bypass Highway with Highway #16 in the City of Prince George, British Columbia, on Thursday, the 22nd of September, 1994 at the hour of eight o'clock in the afternoon (8:00 p.m.) for the purpose of:

- 1) To receive and consider reports of the Directors and the Financial Statement of the Society for the fiscal year ended the 30th of April 1994 and the report of the Auditors thereon.
- 2) To appoint the Auditors of the Society for the ensuing year.
- 3) To elect a Director to fill the vacancy created by the expiration of the term of office of Messr. Jack Mackenzie.
- 4) To elect a Director to fill the vacancy created by the expiration of the term of office of Mme. Carol Tichelman.
- 5) To elect a Director to fill the vacancy created by the expiration of the term of office of Messr. Tom Cole.

AND FURTHER TAKE NOTICE that under Part 5 - Directors and Officers Bylaw 25, (3), a special resolution will be put forward allowing the Directors to dispose of a further .63 of an acre supplemental to the 2.15 acres already approved by special resolution at the Annual Meeting of September 19, 1991.

In case of insufficient nominations being received in the regular manner nominations shall be accepted from the floor at the Annual General Meeting.

From the Superintendent

With the amount of traffic going through the golf course each and every day, damage to turf areas caused by wear becomes a problem. Golfer after golfer walking over the same area causes the grass to thin out and eventually die. These areas become unattractive to look at and if a golf ball lands in these areas, the bounce is always a lot bigger than normal and usually unfavorable.

At our golf course, I use three methods to try and control wear. I use white lines to control all cart traffic around greens, including pull carts. There is a cart path around every green. Power and pull carts should stay to these paths. There are logs around certain areas. These logs are not put there as obstacles to lift carts over; they are put there to prevent carts from going in that direction.

To improve playability of the golf course, please stay to cart paths and outside white lines for power and pull carts. Try to speed traffic by walking in different areas where possible each round of golf you play.

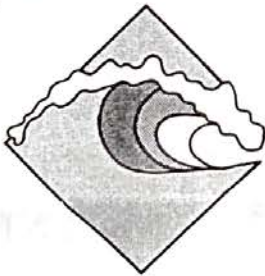

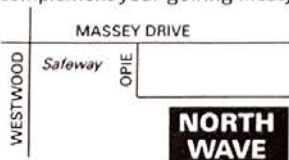

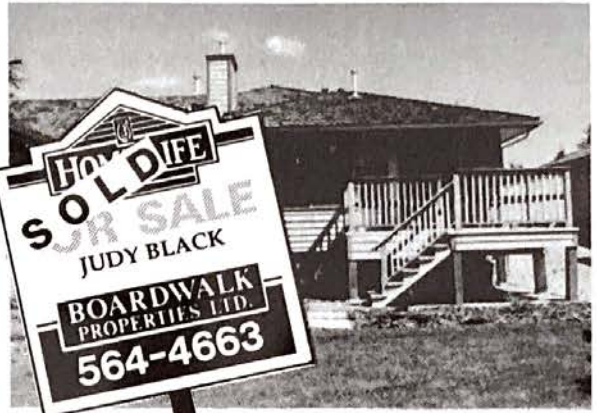
