Attention Members — 1994 Annual Golf Dues

To take advantage of the discount, you must pay in full, by cash or cheque on or before February 15, 1994. The discount will not apply to dues charged on your member account, purchased on a post-dated cheque plan or by credit card.

From the Ice Maker

This is just a reminder to the curling members that ice cleaning is the responsibility of all of us. The practice of having the winners sweep the ice after their games reduces maintenance time between draws without sacrificing ice quality. A thorough job of cleaning the ice involves:

1. Sweeping the ice under the rocks.
2. Sweeping the debris from the hacks and behind them to an area in front of them where the mop has easy access.
3. Sweeping along the side dividers.
4. Pushing the mop up and down the ice, finishing off to the side or in the corner.
5. Removing the debris from the mop and ice surface with the broom and dust pan.

The ice crew cleans and prepares the ice every morning by hand blading, washing out the hacks and applying fresh pebble. For the rest of the day it is up to you, the curler, to clean the ice after every time you use it, whether it be an important league game or just an hour of practice. I would like to thank all of you for your co-operation.
