From the Superintendent

With the opening of the 4th hole, many of you probably notice the rough area to the left front of the green. These marks are pump holes drilled to help the drainage of this area. The pump holes are most effective if the grass fills in from the sides to cover the holes, therefore this area will play as ground under repair until the holes are filled in.

In the position of the old 14th green, the golf club has installed a septic field. The purpose of installing the septic field is so that it is available to service a washroom facility which the club is looking to build when funds become available. The reason for installing it now is so we do not have to dig this area up again once it is finished.

Around all the greens of the golf course, I have painted white lines. These lines are designed to control traffic around the greens thus reducing the damage caused by the traffic. The white lines are there to keep all power and pull carts away from the greens. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated.

Once again divots and ballmarks have become a problem. For the better of the golf course, please replace all divots and repair at least your ballmark and one other. To properly repair

ballmarks, push the grass in from the sides rather than lifting up the bottom of the mark.

Just a reminder that there is a question box in the hallway by the men's and ladies' locker rooms. If you have any question about the golf course, please write them down and put them in the question box.

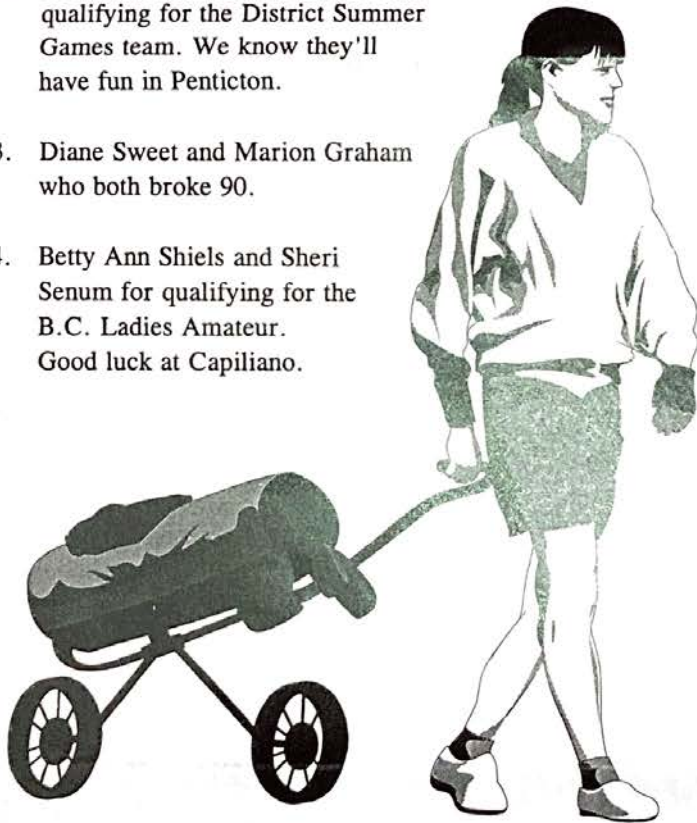


Evening Ladies Golf Report


