- 4) Monitoring slow play on the course and encouraging all members to keep up the pace of play.
- 5) Acting as a sounding board for members' complaints, arbitrate any disputes that may arise and to take appropriate action with respect to questionable conduct by members on the course.
- 6) Work closely with the Course Superintendent, Club Professional, Club Manager, and Ladies Captain.

- 3) **A hole should average 14 minutes of playing time and a player should take a maximum of 45 seconds to play any stroke.**

## British Columbia Senior Games

Kamloops will be the host city for the 1996 B.C. Senior Games to be held on Sept. 4, 5, 6 & 7. Participants are seniors 55 years and over.

B.C. is divided into 12 zones with Prince George as Zone 9.

The first B.C. Senior Games were held in Vernon in 1988 with 650 competitors in 15 events. In 1995, the host cities were Oliver/Osoyoos with 2032 participants in 19 medal events.

Registration for senior golf must be in by May 10th. The age categories for men and women are:

55-59 years of age    60-64 years of age  
65-69 years of age    70-74 years of age  
75-79 years of age    80+ years of age

Low gross and low net for both men and women in each age category.

The qualifying rounds for representatives of P.G. Golf & Curling Club will be played before the 26th of May. Date and time to be published in the May newsletter and by posters on the bulletin board for golfers. Registration fees are \$3.00 plus \$3.00 for B.C. Senior membership.

For the first time, Zone 9 playoffs will be held at the Prince George Golf Course on June 24th at 1:00 p.m. We will host playoffs from Quesnel, Williams Lake, Vanderhoof and Mackenzie. It will be an 18 hole stroke play. The man and woman with the lowest net score in each age category will advance to "The Games."

Entry fee for the games is \$30.00. Gold, Silver and Bronze medals will be awarded to the golfers with the lowest gross scores and lowest net scores in each category.
