The Pounds Add Up



One of the questions I get asked most is why do we build our new greens using a straight sand root zone. This is a good question for we all know that not many plants can grow in sand because it won't hold water and it is very unstable. It's those qualities which make sand undesirable for most planting situations, but it also has those same qualities which make it optimum for a putting green.

We have already discussed the advantages of improved percolation rates with uniform particle sized sand. This is the rate in which oxygen and gases can pass through a sand profile. So let's look at the compaction issue.

We all know sand compacts less than soils, but why are we so concerned with compaction? Well, let's add it up. In 1995, 44,896 rounds of golf were played at the PGG&CC. Every one of those golfers walked on every green. Let's say that the average weight of these golfers is a conservative 150 lbs. In one season, golfers would contribute 6,734,400 lbs. of compaction. The greens are cut approximately 150 times a year. A walk behind mower and operator weighs 358 lbs. To cut #5 green, side to side, the operator and mower make 71 passes and this adds up to 3,812,700 lbs. These are just two examples of everyday compaction and we are already at 10,547,100 lbs. or 5,273 tons on every green. So you can see that the pounds really do add up. This is why in 1953 the U.S.G.A. greens section funded research at the Michigan State

University to develop a compaction resistant growth medium that could also produce an optimum soil water content. What Dr. Ferguson and Dr. Kunze came up with became known as the U.S.G.A. method of greens construction. We build our greens using the U.S.G.A. method in an effort to provide our members with the best putting surface available for many years to come.

"Guardian of the Green"

The GREEN COMMITTEE has re-instated the Guardian of the Green Program to improve the overall condition of the golf course. Each member has been assigned a specific hole on the golf course. We ask that on your assigned hole, you take a little extra time and effort and do as much of the following as you possibly can without slowing play:

1. Spread extra sand and seed mix on the tee box. Ensure that the jug is full when leaving the tee area. Pick up broken tees and put them in the garbage – this will be easier on the mowers.
2. Pick up any garbage that may be lying on your assigned hole.
3. Replace divots that were not put back.
4. Rake footprints left in the sandtraps by inconsiderate golfers.
5. Repair extra ball marks on the assigned green.

Members are reminded that it is always their responsibility to fix their own divot and ball marks on the greens. We know this

doesn't always happen, but with just a bit of extra effort we can improve the condition of the course.

The GREEN COMMITTEE will monitor this program and will give recognition for the best maintained golf holes.

Lists of assigned holes have been posted on the locker room bulletin boards and also on the bulletin board by club storage.

Let's make a conscious effort and have more fun with an improved golf course.

Capital Assessment

After much deliberation and consideration, the Board of Directors have voted to increase the capital assessment to \$20.00 per month from the present \$15.00 per month effective October 1, 1996. A 10% discount on the \$20.00 assessment for seniors and members who reside beyond a 80 kilometer radius from Prince George will also be implemented.

The increase is necessary to enable the improvements to our club (driving range, renovation of the old kitchen area, ice scrapers and greens reconstruction) to be completed in an orderly time frame.

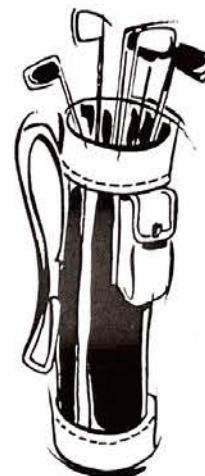

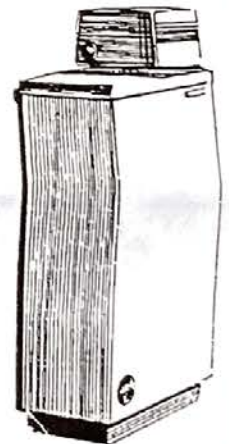

Unfortunately, the types of flowers required were not available to complete the bed this year but work will commence early in the spring of 1997.

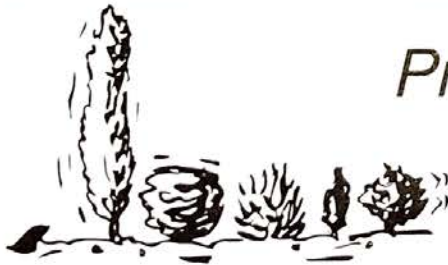


Contest

The league has good, average and beginner curlers. Each year we like to add a few more teams so more seniors can have a few extra laughs and a curling league you feel comfortable belonging to.

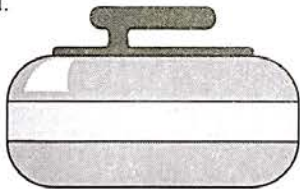
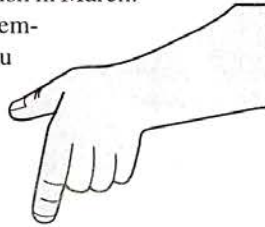
Last year there were 18 teams on Tuesday and 8 teams on Thursday. Hopefully a few more can be added this year.
