## Superintendent's Report

With the 1996 golf season sneaking up on us, I will take this time to bring up a few projects we are looking at completing this year.

We are going to a three tee system beginning in the 1996 season. The three tees, red, white, and blue, will all be rated for the men. The white and red tees will be rated for the women. Most of the tee boxes on the golf course are already big enough to handle this system. However, tees number two, eight, plus sixteen will need to be enlarged. We will be building a joint red tee for numbers two and sixteen ahead of the existing tees. We will be extending the upper tee on number eight to make room for a blue tee on this hole.

We will be adding tee mats to some more tees on the golf course to be used when the teeing area is under stress to help

control the wear on the tees. It is our intention to eventually have a mat on every tee. It is very important that all golfers use these mats when the markers indicate to use them. Golfers moving the markers and teeing off beside the mats cause excessive wear to the tee and increase the maintenance of these areas.

It is our goal this year to start a renovation program on the fairway sand traps. We will be removing the old sand and replacing it with a number eight washed sand which will greatly improve the playability of these traps. We will complete as many traps as time and funds permit.

In continuing with the greens reconstruction program, we will be re-building the eighth and twelfth greens starting August 24th.

Although these are a few projects we will be undertaking this year, I remind the members of the greens committee question box in the hallway by the men's and ladies' locker rooms. Any questions or suggestions, please write them on a piece of paper and put them in the question box.

## From the Ice Maker

Over the last few months curlers from our Club have been travelling all over B.C. curling in Zone, Region and Provincial Playdowns. I am often asked why our ice surface feels different from some of the other clubs they curl in. For the most part its the quality of the water used to make the ice they are sliding on. Why does one water supply give a better sliding and running surface than another? This is mainly due to the mineral content in the water. A lot of clubs have installed water de-mineralizing systems such as Jet Ice or Culligan. In these systems raw water is run through a set of tanks; this process removes most of the mineral content in the water and its this treated water that they use to make and maintain their ice. The Prince George Golf & Curling Club uses plain raw water to make our ice. The analysis of this water indicated a total hardness of 10.5 grains per U.S. gallon and a pH of 7.0. At present we are looking into purchasing or renting a Jet Ice System for the 1996-97 curling season which will give us something to look forward to in the upcoming season.

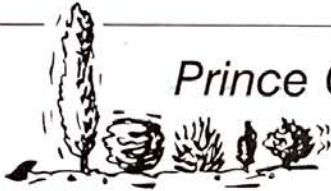

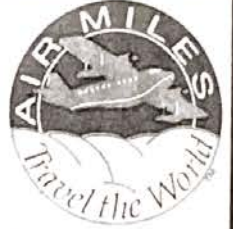

If you are interested, please contact the administration office to obtain the authorization letter.

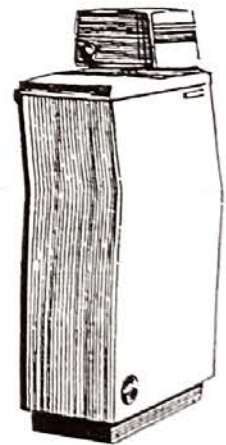
