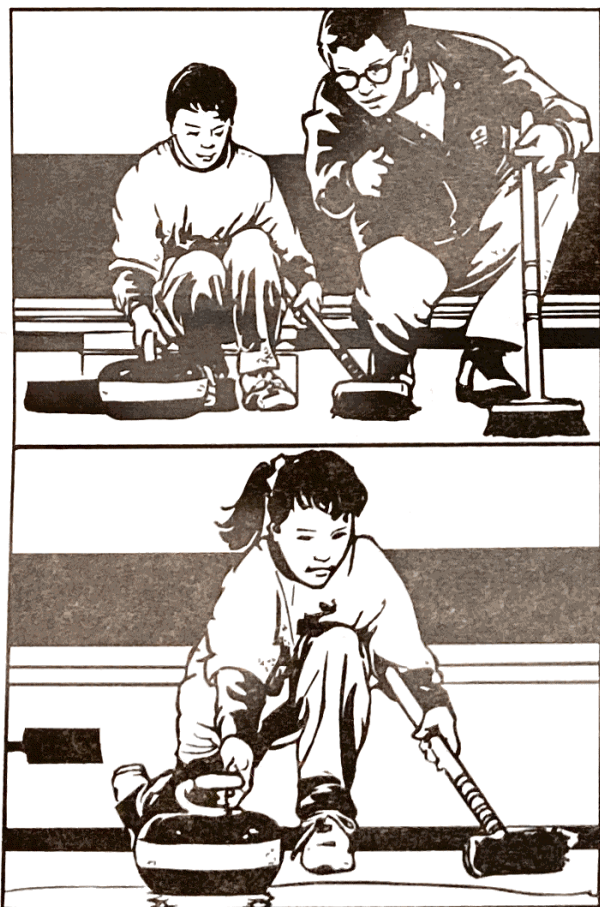
Members elected as directors Larry Boyce for a three year term, and both Vonda Hofferd and Fred Sapach for two year terms.
