GREEN COMMITTEE

One member of the Green Committee has completed her 3-year term in November 2000 and will be resigning from the Committee at that time. If you are interested in filling this position, please send a letter of interest to the attention of the Green Committee and drop it off at the front office by Sept 14, 2000.

Green Committee Terms of Reference

Green Committee Membership

The Green Committee will be made up of six members and a chairperson. This will include:

- Both high and low handicap members
- Both genders

Length of Term

Membership on the Green Committee will be a three-year term, with the option to run for a concurring three years after a one-year lapse in membership.

If a member is absent from three meetings during the committee year without good reason, they shall be asked to resign their position.

Club members interested in filling positions on the Green Committee will submit a written application. If applications exceed positions available, the Committee will make a decision by popular vote.

Functions of the Green Committee

1. Liaison with the Golf Course Superintendent, club members and the Board of Directors.
2. Golf Course Superintendent must liaise with the Green Committee.
3. Respond to member complaints regarding playability and condition of the course.
4. Be acquainted with the problems and the functions of the Golf Course Superintendent and be a buffer between the Golf Course Superintendent and the club membership.
5. Assist the Golf Course Superintendent in an advisory, budgetary and policy-making capacity and recommend the purchasing and maintenance cost of equipment.
6. Upon approval of the maintenance and capital expenditure budget, it is the responsibility of the Golf Course Superintendent and the Green Committee to ensure the completion of projects and expenditures of allotted monies.
7. The Golf Course Superintendent has the authority to close the course at any time because of adverse weather or turf conditions. This includes the authority to prohibit the use of power golf carts when justified. The Golf Course Superintendent's authority will be vested in the Assistant Golf Course Superintendent when the Golf Course Superintendent is not available.
8. Have a thorough knowledge of the golf course in its best playing conditions as well as the perennial trouble spots.
9. Have a general understanding of the technical background required for a sound maintenance program.
10. Oversee and approve designs of new features i.e. greens, tee boxes.
 - The Design Committee will report directly to the Green Committee;
 - The Green Committee has the authority to approve, veto or alter any submitted designs;
 - A member of the Green Committee will be appointed to attend Design Committee meetings and a member of the Design Committee will be appointed to attend Green Committee meetings.
11. Maintain length of course and normal playing difficulty at a constant level.
12. Work with the Golf Course Superintendent to ensure PCGA environmental guidelines for Canadian golf clubs are adhered to, to ensure that only environmentally sound practices are used to reverse unhealthy or unsightly areas of the course. The Green Committee will assist the Golf Course Superintendent in the continuing the Audubon environmental practices.
13. The Green Committee is responsible for the design and maintenance of the driving range.
14. The Green Committee shall:
 - a. Develop and maintain a five year growth plan;
 - b. Monitor the guardian of the green program;
 - c. Establish annual sand & seed dates;
 - d. Liaise with the Golf Professional to ensure that pull and power carts are causing minimal compaction to the course.
15. The Green Committee chairperson will be included in all decisions regarding golf course management positions that relate the Green Committee.
16. Subject to the approval of the Board of Directors, the Golf Course Superintendent will attend monthly Board of Directors meetings and report back to the Green Committee.
17. At least one member of the Green Committee will attend meetings between the RCGA agronomist and the Golf Course Superintendent.
18. Communicate to the club membership any Green Committee decisions and/or actions.

From The Superintendent

There are many different maintenance practices used in the care of a golf course during the year. The most invasive to the golfer is aeration. There are many benefits that result from aeration with the increased ability of oxygen to reach the root system probably the most important result. Some of the other benefits are reduced thatch layer, better water and nutrient movement through soil and the development of the root system. We have two equipment options to obtain the required results. The core aerator that removes plugs of soil is the most beneficial but is also the most disruptive. Core aeration is usually done twice a year, once in the spring and once in the fall under normal conditions. Once aerated, the greens are topdressed to fill holes with sand to keep the columns open and providing the desired benefits longer. The second option is hydrojecting that is far less disruptive but benefits do not last as long and no thatch is removed. This method does not remove a plug but uses pressurized jets of water to penetrate the surface and then spreads out under the surface to reduce compaction, allowing easier root, water and nutrient movement. No topdressing is done and the area is back in play quickly with minimum disruption to playing surface. This method is generally used during the middle of the season as required because of the major disruption core aeration causes to play. As with all maintenance the golf department tries to schedule these practices to cause the least disruption to play as possible but Mother Nature is not always co-operative. As always, the golf department appreciates your patience during these procedures.

REPORT OF DIRECTORS

Four amendments of the Bylaws of the Prince George Golf & Curling Club will be proposed for adoption at the Annual General meeting to be held September 28, 2000.

1. Bylaw 9(3) - amend this bylaw to read as follows:

The Debenture shall be non-interest bearing and shall not be redeemable until the member ceases to be a member **and the Certificate of Membership is cancelled.**

2. Bylaw 10(1) - amend this bylaw to read as follows:

The Certificate of Membership of a regular member in good standing may be transferred without charge to the spouse or common law spouse of the member upon application at any time. **For the purpose of these bylaws the words "common law spouse" shall have the same meaning as defined in the Estate Administration Act of British Columbia.**

3. Bylaw 10(2) - amend this bylaw to read as follows:

The Certificate of Membership of a deceased regular member who was in good standing at the date of death may be transferred without charge to the surviving spouse or common law spouse of the deceased member upon application made not later that twenty-four (24) months after the date of death of the member.

4. Bylaw 1-3) - delete the existing refund bylaw and replace it with the following:

The Certificate of Membership of a regular member in good standing may be transferred to the member's child (including a legally adopted child) or grandchild who has attained the age of 19 years upon application and upon paying a transfer fee in such amount as the directors may determine from time to time. The Certificate of Membership of a deceased regular member who was in good standing at the date of death may be transferred to the deceased member's child (including a legally adopted child) or grandchild who has attained the age of 19 years upon application made not later that twenty-four (24) months after the date of death of the member and upon paying a transfer fee in such amount as the directors may determine from time to time.

5. Bylaw 10(7) - amend this bylaw to read as follows:

The Certificate of Membership of a corporate member may be transferred to a principal owner, **employee or retired employee** of the corporate member upon application and **upon paying a transfer fee in such amount as the directors may determine from time to time.**

The effect of the amendments proposed by the Directors for adoption at the Annual General Meeting are:

1. Bylaw 9(3) - to clarify that the Certificate of Membership needs to be cancelled before the debenture is redeemed.
2. Bylaw 10(1) - to allow the transfer of membership by a regular member to a common law spouse.
3. Bylaw 10(2) - to allow the transfer of membership by a deceased regular member to a common law spouse.
4. Bylaw 10(3) - to delete the old refund bylaw, and to allow the transfer of membership by regular member or a deceased regular member to a child or grandchild.
5. Bylaw 10(7) - to allow the transfer of membership by a corporate member to an employee or retired employee of the company.

Amendment #1 is housekeeping in nature. Amendments #2 and #3 correspond with current family law. Amendments #4 and #5 are in response to the membership survey of March 2000 which revealed the respondents to the survey were in support of such changes by favorable votes of 87% and 66% respectively.

FROM THE CURLING COMMITTEE

The ice is in and ready for practice! The ice was in fact installed a bit early as Murray conducted Level 1 and Level 2 Icemaker Clinics for people in our region. These clinics helped defray the early start up costs. Two of our employees attended the clinics which should provide a long-term benefit to the Club. Ice will be available for Competitive Curlers to get a jump-start on their season. Please contact Bill Lim or the club office if you are interested in participating in a September warm-up league.

Clinics for beginners will be held this month and hosted once again by Cliff Warner. Please call the office for times and cost. We will hold as many as are required as we expect an influx of new curlers following last year's Scott Tournament of Hearts.

There will be an organizational change this year as we will not be hiring a separate Curling Coordinator. This is the next step in required cost cuts and the workload will be shared by Tammy, Murray and the ice crew staff. We will also be asking for volunteers from each league to look after the draws for each square. With a bit of cooperation from all we should have few problems.

We will be soliciting advertising signs on the walls of the curling rink this season. If you are interested, please give Denis a call. It will be affordable and should be very effective.

On a final positive note, we will be purchasing new rocks for 4 sheets of ice this year. We have to decide if we should purchase granite inserts (10-year warranty) or ceramic inserts (20 year warranty). Scott Sherba and Murray will call around to clubs who have purchased new rocks in the last few years to see which way we should go. In any event, we should have new rocks early in the season. There will be a one-time fee of \$10.00 per curler combined with the monies collected by various bonspiels to help finance these new rocks. The Club will then match any of the funds raised. With a bit of further fund-raising we should easily make this work.

Next month I will introduce your Curling Committee and Bonspiel Chairpersons. On behalf of the Club and the Curling Committee, I wish you a great season!
